Chief Royal was also recently named International Fire Chief of the Year by the International Association of Fire Chiefs (IAFC). He also provided an interesting perspective on the evolution of fire prevention, mitigation, and firefighting during his presentation. His service as a First Responder for four decades, culminating in his leadership of the CSFD is the epitome of the MOWW motto, "It is Nobler to Serve, than to be Served".

HISTORIAN ARTICLE

COLORADO SPRINGS NEIGHBORHOOD PARK NAMED FOR VIETNAM WAR MEDAL OF HONOR RECIPIENT ROY P. BENAVIDEZ

The Pikes Peak Veterans Council (PPVC) is working with other veteran organizations to support the dedication of a neighborhood park located at 975 Afternoon Circle. This 7.1-acre park will accommodate sand volleyball, picnic shelter, and playground. The following are highlights from the Citation that accompanies his Medal of Honor plus information from other sources:

- Sgt. Benevidez voluntarily boarded a returning aircraft to assist in another extraction attempt after three helicopters were shot down in previous attempts.
- Wounded in his right leg, face, and head while rescuing wounded soldiers and recovering the bodies of the dead soldiers.
- Despite his severe wounds and under intense enemy fire, he carried and dragged half of the wounded team members to the awaiting aircraft.

- Sgt. Benevidez was severely wounded by small-arms fire in the abdomen and grenade fragments in his back while retrieving classified documents from a fallen team leader.
- Sgt. Benevidez mustered his strength, began calling in tactical air strikes and directed the fire from supporting gunships to suppress the enemy's fire and so permitted another extraction attempt.
- He was wounded again in his thigh by small-arms fire
 while administering first aid to a wounded team
 member just before another extraction helicopter
 was able to land. His indomitable spirit kept him
 going as he began to ferry his comrades to the craft.
- On his second trip with the wounded, he was clubbed from additional wounds to his head and arms before killing his adversary.
- During the six hours of continuous operations,
 Benavidez suffered a broken jaw and 37 bullet and bayonet puncture wounds.

NATIONAL PROGRAM -ARTICLE HOMELAND SECURITY (HS)

REAL ID

The REAL ID Act, passed by Congress in 2005, enacted the 9/11 Commission's recommendation that the Federal Government "set standards for the issuance of

sources of identification, such as driver's licenses and identification cards." The Act



and implementing regulations establish minimum security standards for license issuance and production and prohibit federal agencies from accepting for certain official purposes noncompliant driver's licenses and identification cards.

The official purposes covered by the Act and regulation are:

- Accessing certain federal facilities;
- Boarding Federally regulated commercial aircraft; and

• Entering nuclear power plants.

Secure driver's licenses and identification documents are a vital component of the national security framework. DHS/TSA is committed to enforcing the REAL ID Act, therefore, beginning May 7, 2025, anyone 18 years and older that plans to fly domestically or visit certain Federal facilities will need a REAL ID or another acceptable form of identification.

The Act's prohibitions do not affect other uses of driver's licenses or identification cards unrelated to official purposes as defined in the Act.

However, some credentials such as CO-RCSA driver licenses and identification cards, don't have a gold or black star and are not REAL ID compliant." Because of JCU deployment status, unit personnel receive a widerange of training. This training includes: UHF and SHF satellite systems, local area network (LAN), wide area network (WAN), Servers, Active Directory, Networking, voice over internet protocol (VOIP), video teleconference (VTC), Video Distribution, fiber system installation and advanced tactical communication scenarios on various air, land, and sea platforms.

Joint Communications Unit (JCU)

Last month's newsletter featured the Joint Communications Support Element (Airborne) (JCSE). This month's newsletter features JCU. The JCU is a technical unit of the United States Special Operations Command charged to standardize and ensure



interoperability of communication procedures and equipment of the Joint Special Operations Command and its subordinate units. The JCU was activated at Ft. Bragg, NC in 1980, after the failure of Operation Eagle Claw (aka Desert one). The JCU has earned the reputation of "DoD's Finest Communicators".

The Joint Communications Unit (JCU) is the premiere communications organization within the Department of Defense. It is comprised of members from the Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, and Civilian personnel in a variety of communications, automation, electronics maintenance, and logistic specialties.

JCU members are trained to be communication experts and afforded uncommon opportunities as a

VETERAN'S AFFAIRS

Veterans Administration (VA.gov) website login transitioning from four (DS Logon, ID.me, Login.gov and My Healthevet) to two authentication services (Login.gov and ID.me) to move to a simpler and more modern sign-in experience. VA will remove the My HealtheVet option after January 31, 2025 and the DS Logon option after September 30, 2025.

- Login.gov is the government's one account provider for VA and other government benefits and services. The U.S. General Services Administration creates and maintains your account.
- ID.me is a non-government account provider that contracts with government and non-government organizations.
- Both Login.gov and ID.me meet modern security standards. Both accounts protect your data so only you can access and change your stored information.

Both **Login.gov** and **ID.me** let you use a single, secure account to access your VA benefits and services. You can use either account to manage some other government benefits and services (like Social Security benefits).



ROCKY MOUNTAIN YOUTH LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE 2024

The Rocky Mountain Youth Leadership Conference (RMYLC) is sponsored, in part, by the Military Order of the World Wars (MOWW), under their Patriotic Education Program. The Rocky Mountain Youth Leadership Foundation (RMYLF) is an independent nonprofit that exists solely to provide resources for the operation and continuous improvement of the RMYLC. The RMYLC is a 5-day, inresidence, leadership education opportunity for rising high school seniors, conducted every year, in the last full week of June. The Foundation is an all-volunteer corporation whose entire resources are dedicated to the future of the RMYLC.

The Conference has been held in over six different locations including the United States Air Force Academy and in conjunction with another MOWW Chapter in Phoenix, Arizona. From modest beginnings with 17 students, the RMYLC has grown to accept 100 high school seniors each year. Since 1993, over 2,100 Colorado high school students have graduated from the RMYLC.
