He also provided an interesting perspective on the evolution of fire prevention, mitigation, and firefighting during his presentation. His service as a First Responder for four decades, culminating in his leadership of the CSFD is the epitome of the MOWW motto, "It is Nobler to Serve, than to be Served".
